RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Step Into the Light

How strange it is to think that if not for Herod’s directions, the magi would not have known where to find Jesus. They were not Jews, they knew nothing of the old prophecies. It was Herod who convened the scholars. It was Herod who pointed the way — for ulterior motives, certainly, but nonetheless, this is the part he played. It was Herod who made the Epiphany possible.

“Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance,” writes the prophet (Isaiah 60:3). A king may keep to the shadows, suspicious of the light — he may foolishly imagine he can snatch it from the sky to keep as his own possession, and, upon finding the light cannot be governed, grow to loathe it, and even seek to extinguish it once and for all.

But all his grand designs will come to nothing because there is no king so powerful that he can see in the dark. And even a man like Herod — a man so jealous that he sought to kill God — cannot prevent the breaking of day.

The Epiphany marks the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. It is a celebration of truth reaching places it was not expected to reach, of brightness illuminating corners of the world long ago consigned to shadow. It is a reminder that the battle has already been won, the night is over. All that remains is for us to decide: will we step into the light?

Qué extraño es pensar que, si no fuera por las indicaciones de Herodes, los reyes magos no habrían sabido dónde encontrar a Jesús. No eran judíos, no sabían nada de las antiguas profecías. Fue Herodes quien convoco a los sabios. Fue Herodes quien señaló el camino; con motivos ocultos, ciertamente, pero, de todos modos, este es el papel que desempeñó. Fue Herodes quien hizo posible la Epifanía.

“Caminarán los pueblos a tu luz y los reyes, al resplandor de tu aurora,” escribe el profeta (Isaías 60:3). Un rey puede permanecer en las sombras, sospechando de la luz; puede imaginar tontamente que puede arrebatlarla del cielo para conservarla como posesión suya y, al descubrir que la luz no puede ser gobernada, llegar a detestarla e incluso tratar de extinguirla de una vez por todas.

Pero todos sus grandes diseños quedarán en nada porque no hay ningún rey tan poderoso que pueda ver en la oscuridad. E incluso un hombre como Herodes, un hombre tan celoso que buscó matar a Dios, no puede evitar el amanecer.

La Epifanía marca la manifestación de Cristo a los gentiles. Es una celebración de la verdad que llega a lugares donde no se esperaba que llegara, del brillo que ilumina rincones del mundo que hace mucho tiempo estaban relegados a la sombra. Es un recordatorio de que la batalla ya está ganada, la noche ha terminado. Lo único que nos queda es decidir: ¿daremos un paso hacia la luz?

What the Church celebrates today is the manifestation of our Lord to the whole world; after being made known to the shepherds of Bethlehem He is revealed to the Magi who have come from the East to adore Him. Christian tradition has ever seen in the Magi the first fruits of the Gentiles; they lead in their wake all the peoples of the earth, and thus the Epiphany is an affirmation of universal salvation. St. Leo brings out this point admirably in a sermon, read at Matins, in which he shows in the adoration of the Magi the beginnings of Christian faith, the time when the great mass of the heathen sets off to follow the star which summons it to seek its Savior. INSPIRATION FOR THE WEEK

Though the magi did not know where the star of Bethlehem would lead, they trusted that God would be with them along the way. Let us all embrace that same faith as we go about the journey God has planned for us this year.

REFLECT AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

First Reading: Isaiah foresaw a future when the Lord would use Israel as His instrument to shine His glory into the world. What could you do this week to show God's glory to others?

Second Reading: Paul met a lot of resistance when he spoke of God's "revelation" that Gentiles are "coheirs" and "copartners" with Jews in the divine promise fulfilled in Christ Jesus. How welcoming are you to outsiders?

Gospel: In the story of the magi's visit, we see the prophecies of Isaiah (our first reading) fulfilled with the treasures of gold, frankincense, and myrrh given to the Holy Family. What gift do you give to the Lord?
