### Did you know? June 17-18:

#### **ACT to prevent heatstroke**

A hot car is one of the most dangerous places for a baby or a young child. Cars can heat up to 19 degrees in 10 minutes, and cracking a window will not provide enough air for a child stuck in a hot car. Parents and caregivers can use ACT to help keep children safe.

- **Avoid** heatstroke-related injuries by never leaving children alone in the car, and locking cars to prevent children from getting in.
- **Create** reminders, like a stuffed animal, in the car to remind you that you need to get a child out when you exit.
- **Take** action. If you see a child alone in a car, call 911 immediately. For more information, visit <https://www.safekids.org/heatstroke>.

### **ACTÚE para prevenir un ataque cardíaco provocado por el calor**

Un automóvil caliente es uno de los lugares más peligrosos para un bebé o un niño pequeño. Los automóviles pueden calentarse hasta 19 grados en 10 minutos, y abrir una ventana no proporcionará suficiente aire para un niño atrapado en un automóvil caliente. Los siguientes son consejos para que los padres de familia y cuidadores ayuden a mantener seguros a los niños:

- **Evite** las lesiones relacionadas con ataques cardíacos provocados por calor al no dejar nunca a los niños solos en el automóvil, y cierre el automóvil con llave para evitar que los niños entren.
- **Cree** recordatorios, como un animal de peluche, dentro del automóvil para recordarle que debe sacar a un niño cuando usted salga del auto.


## SUMMER ACTIVITIES



## REFLECT AND RESPOND TO SCRIPTURE

**First Reading:** The Lord teaches Moses that Israel is intended to be his “treasured possession among all peoples ... a kingdom of priests, a holy nation.” How would you react when you receive an incredible gift?

**Second Reading:** Paul teaches the Christians in Rome that believers are reconciled to God and saved from the final wrath through the death of his Son, Jesus. What do you think we should do with this incredible message of reconciliation and salvation?

**Gospel:** Jesus commissioned the twelve disciples to “proclaim the kingdom of heaven is at hand” and “cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons” — in other words, disciples are called to follow Jesus’ lead. How can we modern disciples follow Jesus’ lead?

Gospel - Matthew 9:36—10:8 A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew At the sight of the crowds, Jesus' heart was moved with pity for them because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." Then he summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits to drive them out and to cure every disease and every illness. The names of the twelve apostles are these: first, Simon called Peter, and his brother Andrew; James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John; Philip and Bartholomew, Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James, the son of Alphaeus, and Thaddeus; Simon from Cana, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed him. Jesus sent out these twelve after instructing them thus, "Do not go into pagan territory or enter a Samaritan town. Go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Evangelio - Mateo 9, 36-10, 8 Lectura del santo Evangelio según San Mateo En aquel tiempo, al ver Jesus a las multitudes, se compadecía de ellas, porque estaban extenuadas y desamparadas, como ovejas sin pastor. Entonces dijo a sus discípulos: "La cosecha es mucha y los trabajadores, pocos. Rueguen, por lo tanto, al dueño de la mies que envíe trabajadores a sus campos". Despues, llamando a sus doce discípulos, les dio poder para expulsar a los espíritus impuros y curar toda clase de enfermedades y dolencias. Estos son los nombres de los doce apostoles: el primero de todos, Simon, llamado Pedro, y su hermano Andres; Santiago y su hermano Juan, hijos de Zebedeo; Felipe y Bartolome ; Tomas y Mateo, el publicano; Santiago, hijo de Alfeo, y Tadeo; Simon, el cananeo, y Judas Iscariote, que fue el traidor. A estos doce los envió Jesus con estas instrucciones: "No vayan a tierra de paganos ni entren en ciudades de samaritanos. Vayan mas bien en busca de las ovejas perdidas de la casa de Israel. Vayan y proclamen por el camino que ya se acerca el Reino de los cielos. Curen a los leprosos y demás enfermos; resuciten a los muertos y echen fuera a los demonios. Gratuitamente han recibido este poder; ejerzan lo, pues, gratuitamente".
