

Fr. Kirks Message August 16, 2020

August 16, 2020

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Matthew opens the scene in today's Gospel by setting up a conflict. Unlike the parallel story in Mark (7:24), the woman is described as "a Canaanite." This label serves to evoke the ancient animosity between Jews and other peoples in the region. The woman, who is never named, begs for help for her daughter. The disciples are actively dismissive of her, as a woman and a foreigner, and deem her to be unworthy of their attention. The text suggests that Jesus initially sided with the disciples. But then he recognized the strength of her faith.

Many women, foreigners, or marginalized persons might identify with this woman's story. Sometimes faith means standing fast, in care for others or in fidelity to truth, even when it seems that no one supports you. Somehow, the woman recognized God's power and God's care within Jesus. And Jesus recognized that God was active within her, manifested in her commitment to her daughter. Jesus saw his Father's larger horizon of care for everyone, Jew and Gentile, within this faith-filled woman.

A NEW TEMPLE

Isaiah articulates the vision that it is God's deep desire that all human beings will respond to God in prayer and thanksgiving. God will summon everyone to "my holy mountain," that is, the temple Mount. The temple was the primary symbol of God's presence among the people. The Temple was where communal worship and sacrifice took place. Worship served to give thanks for God's blessings on the people. Sacrifice served to help heal relationships between God and Israel, and within the community, when sin had damaged or broken them.

The early church reflected upon this vision and saw Jesus as a new temple. The person of Jesus is to be worshiped as God's active presence within human life. Jesus is to be worshiped in prayer and thanksgiving, and Jesus is where relationships are healed and renewed. In Jesus, God invites the whole world into God's loving care.

Vigésimo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

En el Evangelio de hoy de Mateo, se presenta la parte de una historia donde hay un conflicto. A diferencia de una historia paralela en Marcos (7:24), la mujer es descrita como "una cananea". Esta palabra sirve para etiquetarla y así evoca la antigua enemistad entre los judíos y otros pueblos de la región. La mujer, cuyo nombre no se menciona, pide ayuda para su hija. Los discípulos la desprecian intensamente, tanto como mujer y como extranjera; considerándola indigna de recibir atención. El texto sugiere que Jesús primero se puso de lado de los discípulos, pero luego él reconoció la fuerza de la fe de la mujer.

Muchas mujeres, personas extranjeras o marginadas podrían identificarse con la historia de esta mujer. A veces la fe significa mantenerse firme, en el cuidado de los demás o en la fidelidad a la verdad, incluso cuando parezca que nadie te apoye. De alguna manera, la mujer reconoció el poder de Dios y el cuidado de Jesús dentro de Jesús. Y Jesús notó que Dios estaba activo dentro de ella, manifestado en su compromiso con su hija. Jesús vio el horizonte más amplio de su Padre de cuidado a todos, judíos, no judíos, dentro de esta mujer llena de fe.

UN NUEVO TEMPLO

Isaías explica la visión profunda que Dios tiene de que todos los humanos respondan a Dios en la oración y en la acción de gracias. Dios convocará a todos en "mi montaña sagrada" que es, el Monte del Templo. El templo fue el símbolo principal de la presencia de Dios en el pueblo. El templo era el lugar donde se realizaba el culto y sacrificios. La adoración servía para ayudar a sanar las relaciones entre Dios e Israel, y dentro de la comunidad, cuando el pecado las había dañado o roto.

La Iglesia primitiva reflexionó esta visión y vio a Jesús como un nuevo templo. La persona de Jesús debe ser adorada como la presencia activa de Dios dentro de la vida humana. Jesús debe ser adorado en la oración y en la acción de gracias, y Jesús está donde las relaciones son curadas y renovadas. En Jesús, Dios invita a todo el mundo al cuidado amoroso de Dios.



the first report since February 2020. The table above indicates the financial status through June 30, 2020 and represents annual totals for Fiscal Year 19/20. The LA Archdiocese and the parish were able to secure a Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) grant of \$37,990 that became available in late April early May. This grant was fully utilized for staff salaries and other eligible expenses in May and June. With this grant and withdrawals totaling \$75,000 from the parish Investment Pool, the annual balance of \$9,038 was achieved.

In comparison to last Fiscal Year (19/20), the income was significantly lower this fiscal year than last and expenses were also significantly lower. Due to cessation of services to prevent COVID-19 infections and changes in the parish telephone system, utility costs were significantly lower this year. Unfortunately, COVID-19 disrupted more than just the masses as all fundraising activities (St. Patrick's Day dinner, Festival, etc.) as well as Aquinas Hall rentals were suspended starting in March 2020. This reduced revenue by an estimate of more than \$40,000. Parishioner contributions were strong throughout the year including approximately \$40,000 donated to the Building Fund. We are extremely grateful to the Parishioners for their ongoing support during these challenging times.

The Together in Mission 2020 pledges and contributions are still below the goal by 26% and below last year at this time by more than 10%. If you have not done so we request that you please consider participating at whatever level you feel comfortable as soon as possible. The parish office can assist you if you have lost your pledge envelope.

The Fiscal Year 20/21 budget has been submitted to the Los Angeles Archdiocese. In order to balance projected expenses without further dipping into reserves, it is necessary for all contributions and donations to remain consistent and slightly higher if possible. We are also praying that services and events may be restored in this Fiscal Year God willing.
