Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Did you ever wonder why Jesus sent them out two by two? Not threes, not groups of four? Perhaps it is just the most practical configuration. Recall that in last week's Gospel Jesus was not accepted in his own town and was astonished by the lack of faith that he found there. The disciples would be too new in their faith to know how to deal with that kind of rejection. With three you always end up two against one. With a pair, the two could support each other emotionally and spiritually, and lift each other up in prayer. When traveling, having a companion was much safer than being on one's own, and if there were treacherous spots in the journey, they could help each other through. If you were begging for lodging, two might be able to get in, while a larger group might not be so fortunate. The Gospel gives no indication of who the partners were, but presumably they were sent in combinations that made each pair the strongest proclaimers of Christ. They were able to drive off many demons and cure illnesses.

**SHAKE THE DUST OFF YOUR FEET**

Jesus told the pairs of disciples, "Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." Jesus is preparing the disciples for the experience he had in his home town. This is how you behave when you are not accepted. He didn't tell them to curse them or threaten them, just simply shake off the dust and move on. Rejection is a hard thing for any of us, and Jesus is teaching us how to handle it, as if to say "Pick your battles." This is a good reminder to us all in a time and culture when the climate is so politically charged. Know when it is best to shake the dust and walk away from social media, from an angry word, or from something that won't turn out well. Respond and stay true to your calling.

Decimoquinto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

¿Te has preguntado alguna vez por qué Jesús los envió de dos en dos? ¿No de tres, o en grupos de cuatro? Tal vez sea simplemente un número práctico. Recordemos que en el Evangelio de la semana pasada Jesús no fue aceptado en su propio pueblo y se asombró de la falta de fe que encontró ahí. Los discípulos serían demasiado nuevos en su fe para saber cómo afrontar ese tipo de rechazo. Teniendo a tres, siempre se acaba siendo dos contra uno. Con dos personas, ambos podían apoyarse emocional y espiritualmente y animarse mutuamente en la oración. Al viajar, tener un compañero era mucho más seguro que estar solo, y si había lugares peligrosos en el camino, podían ayudarse solidariamente a pasar. Si buscando caridad pedían alojamiento, a dos se les podría facilitar más mientras que a un grupo más numeroso se le podía dificultar. El Evangelio no indica quiénes eran los compañeros, pero es de suponer que fueron enviados en combinaciones que hicieron de cada pareja los más fuertes proclamadores de Cristo. Ellos fueron capaces de expulsar demonios y curar enfermedades.

SACUDAN EL POLVO DE SUS PIES

Jesús dijo a las parejas de discípulos: "Cualquier lugar que no los reciba ni los escuche, salgan de ahí y sacúdanse el polvo de sus pies como testimonio contra de ellos". Jesús está preparando a sus discípulos para la experiencia que él tuvo en su pueblo de origen. Así es como te comportas cuando no eres aceptado. No les dijo que maldijeran o amenazaran, sino solo simplemente sacúdanse el polvo y sigan adelante. El rechazo es algo duro para cualquiera de nosotros, y Jesús nos está enseñando cómo afrontarlo, como diciendo "elige tus batallas". Este es un buen recordatorio para todos nosotros en una época y cultura en la que el clima está tan cargado políticamente. Saber cuando es mejor sacudir el polvo y alejarse de las redes sociales, de una palabra molesta o de algo que no va a tener un buen resultado. Responde y mantente fiel a tu vocación.

** Restricted income includes: The Building Fund, Religious Education, and donations with specific use designations by the donor.

The table above indicates the financial status through April 30, 2021 and represents annual totals for Fiscal Year 20/21. The Parish was blessed to receive a large donation in September from the estate of a previous parishioner. However, this donation is earmarked for the support of evangelization and is not available to be

utilized for operational expenses and the positive balance year to date is attributed to this donation.

This report represents 83.3% of the 20/21 Fiscal Year. As reported in our last financial report update, envelopes, plate and online collections are slightly higher than last Fiscal Year (19/20). However, income from all special services such as Baptisms, Marriages, Religious Education, etc. is significantly lower than last Fiscal Year. In addition, although loosening COVID restrictions for in-person events is generating more interest in use of parish facilities, these bookings are for next Fiscal Year.

Thanks to generous ongoing contributions to the Building Fund, we have been able to do needed maintenance around the parish facilities such as complete remodel of the Youth Room, repainting in the chapel and extensive cleaning of the Aquinas Hall in preparation for event rentals.

Parish Administration realizes these are very challenging times, but if it is possible to increase your contributions, even slightly, this will greatly assist the Parish meet its expenses and reduce the need for withdrawals from the Parish Contingency Fund.

FEAST OF FAITH

Invitation to the Eucharistic Prayer

After the presider washes his hands, he turns to the people and says, "Pray that our sacrifice may be acceptable to God the almighty Father." We have brought forward bread and wine, and now we are asked to see in these simple gifts upon the altar a sacrifice offered to God. Our response is rich in theological meaning. "May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands." The words point to the unique role of the priest, whose hands, at his ordination, were anointed for just this purpose: that he might "sanctify the Christian people and offer sacrifice to God" (Rite of Ordination). We ask God to accept our sacrifice not because it is worthy of God, but simply "for the praise and glory of his name." God does not need our offering, but allows us to give it so that we might grow in holiness. And God, never to be outdone in generosity, gives all that we have given back to us, "for our good and the good of all his Church." This Mass benefits not just those who have gathered, but, in the mysterious economy of grace, the whole Church. In the words of Saint Paul, when one part rejoices, the whole body "share[s] its joy" (1 Corinthians 12:26).

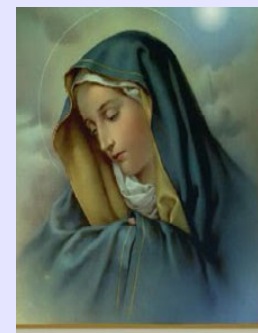
FIESTA DE LA FE

El dinero y otros dones

Durante la presentación de las ofrendas, junto con el pan y el vino se trae la colecta. El pan y el vino se llevan al altar y el dinero se queda en un lugar apropiado. San Justino, en el siglo II, nos recuerda que al reunimos a celebrar la Eucaristía no podemos "dejar de pensar en los pobres y necesitados"; este mismo dinero se da para "los pobres o para la Iglesia" y "se considera también como dones" (IGMR, 73). El dinero como don, no es sucio y tiene mucho sentido compartirlo. No hay que compartir lo que sobra, eso es limosna; la caridad como una corresponsabilidad por el pobre y por las necesidades de la Iglesia, sale desde el corazón. Damos a la Iglesia y a los pobres de lo que tenemos para vivir. Lo damos como agradecimiento por lo que hemos recibido. No damos limosna al pobre para desentendernos de él, de sus necesidades y luchas; vivimos la caridad con él o ella como hermano que es, damos desde el corazón interesándonos por su calidad de vida, por su necesidad humana inmediata. Vivimos la caridad desde la compasión, no desde la lástima como se hace con la limosna. Dar limosna empobrece; vivir la caridad enriquece, porque sale desde el corazón y, como la viuda del Evangelio, damos cuanto tenemos para vivir.

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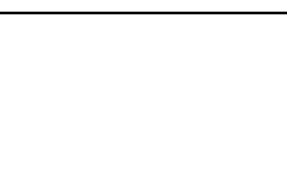
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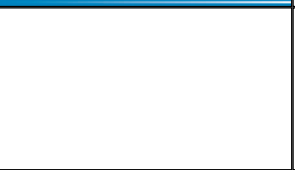
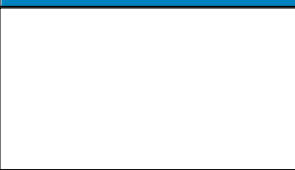
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
