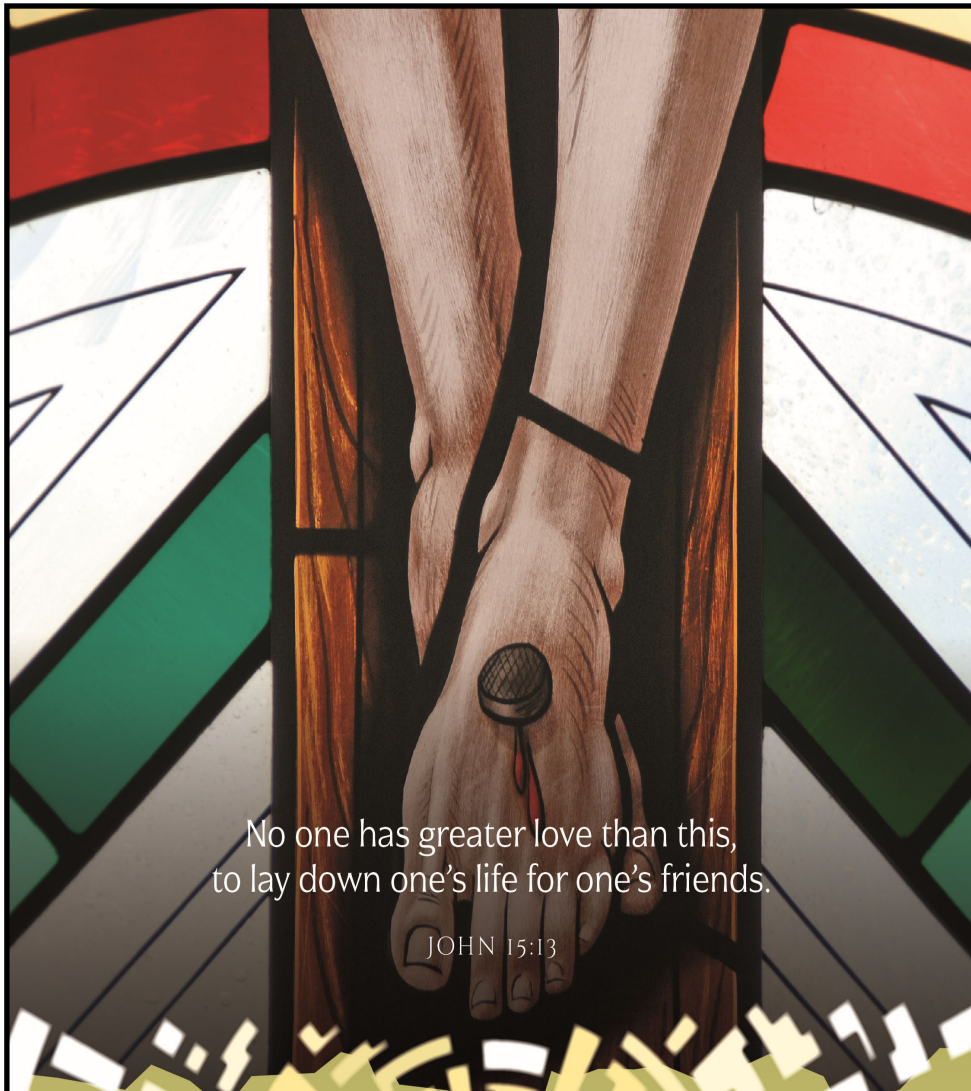

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Love calls and causes us to do great things, more than we might believe we are capable of. While some are called to give their lives as martyrs, most of us find ourselves called to lay down our lives in smaller ways in the midst of everyday life. Parents lose sleep in the early moments of their baby's life, and again as their teens mature and gain independence. Adult children change their plans to care for aging parents. We hear the call of love as we become attentive and respond to the needs of the poor, lonely, sick, and vulnerable. Love causes us to turn our lives around, to strive to become more Christ-like in our words and actions. Peter followed this call of love when he entered the house of Cornelius, a Gentile. He was likely as astounded at the outpouring of the Holy Spirit as were the believers who accompanied him, yet love caused Peter to see beyond the accepted boundaries of religion and race, seeing instead evidence of the Lord's great love at work.

El amor nos llama y nos hace hacer cosas grandes, más de las que nos creemos capaces. Mientras que algunos están llamados a dar su vida como mártires, la mayoría de nosotros nos encontramos llamados a dar nuestra vida en formas pequeñas en medio de la vida cotidiana. Los padres de familia pierden el sueño en los primeros momentos de la vida de su bebé, y una vez más cuando los adolescentes maduran y adquieren independencia. Los hijos adultos cambian sus planes para cuidar de sus padres ancianos. Escuchamos la llamada del amor cuando nos volvemos atentos y respondemos a las necesidades de los pobres, personas solas, enfermas y vulnerables. El amor nos lleva a dar un giro a nuestras vidas, a esforzarnos por parecernos más como Cristo en nuestras palabras y acciones. Pedro siguió esta llamada de amor cuando entró en la casa de Cornelio, un hombre que no era judío. Probablemente él y quienes lo acompañaban se quedaron tan sorprendido por la efusión del Espíritu Santo, pero el amor hizo que Pedro viera más allá de los límites aceptados de la religión y la raza, y en cambio viera la evidencia del gran amor del Señor.

THE JOY-FILLED WAY OF LOVE

Following the Lord calls us to sacrifice for the sake of others, giving our attention, time, and resources in order to share Christ's care and compassion. Jesus shows us that giving of self, pouring ourselves out in love for another, is a joy-filled way of life. Joy is more than a feeling and is deeper than happiness. Joy comes with the assurance that Christ is with us when our lives mirror the life and way of our Master. Joy is a sense of fulfillment in knowing and sharing Christ's love. When we reach out in love, Christ's joy fills our hearts. Strengthened by the power of the Holy Spirit, we find the grace to follow Jesus' command to love one another.

NOVENA TO SAINT RITA
 Novena will begin May 13, 2019
 The conclusion of the Novena to Saint Rita is her Feast Day of May 22nd.
 Blessed red roses will be distributed. The custom of blessing and distributing roses commemorates the blooming of a rose in the garden of the saint's home in the cold of winter." Rita, on her death bed, had requested a relative to bring her a rose from her winter garden, which she hastened to bring to the saint. It also commemorates the sweet odor which emanates from the body of the saint at times when she bestows her favors upon her followers. Vatican officials, in their investigation of her life, were so impressed with this event that they accepted it as one of the miracles required for her canonization.

THE PRESENCE OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

We have a unique episode in the Acts of the Apostles today. A whole roomful of people are baptized with the Holy Spirit before they are baptized with water! The verb used—“the Holy Spirit ‘fell’ on them” (Acts 10:44)—is characteristic of the way the Spirit works throughout the book of Acts: powerful and surprising. Though this “baptism” is not the normative way the New Testament describes baptism, it is still a good reminder today that the Holy Spirit is not controlled by whether or not we pour water, but rather that our sacramental signs reveal the presence of the Spirit at work among us. And we have a double reinforcement of how this work is accomplished from a Letter and a Gospel bearing John’s name. It is love, self-sacrificing and self-giving love, that manifests the Spirit of Jesus in our midst. It is love that is the greatest of commandments. The Spirit is manifested equally through those who live in that love.

LA PRESENCIA DEL ESPÍRITU SANTO

Hoy tenemos un episodio único en los Hechos de los Apóstoles. ¡Un grupo de personas que llena una habitación es bautizado con el Espíritu Santo antes de que se bautizaran con agua! La palabra que se usa para describir el suceso: “el Espíritu Santo descendió sobre ellos” (Hechos 10:44), es característica de la forma en que el Espíritu obra en todo el libro de los Hechos: de manera poderosa y sorprendente. Aunque este “bautismo” no es la norma para describir el bautismo en el Nuevo Testamento, es sin embargo un buen recordatorio de que el Espíritu Santo no está controlado por si hemos vertido el agua o no, sino que nuestros signos sacramentales revelan al Espíritu presente y obrando entre nosotros. Y tenemos un doble refuerzo de cómo esta obra se lleva a cabo en la carta y el Evangelio que llevan el nombre de Juan. Es el amor, el auto sacrificio y el amor de entrega, que manifiestan al Espíritu de Jesús entre nosotros. El amor es el más grande de los mandamientos. El Espíritu se manifiesta también a través de los que viven en ese amor.
