Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's Gospel continues into a second day the narrative that had begun the day before when, after crossing the lake to look for Jesus, a large crowd are fed with five barley loaves and two fish. The following day (today's reading), after more lake crossings, the people who had been miraculously fed are again searching for Jesus. However, they do so (as Jesus puts it) "not because you saw signs, but because you ate the loaves and were filled" (John 6:6).

In John's Gospel, the word "sign" has a distinct meaning. At the wedding at Cana, after telling how Jesus turned water into wine, the Evangelist notes "Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs" that "revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him" (John 2:11). For John, signs are not just wonders to behold; they are about the revelation of God and a response of faith in Jesus.

MAYBE THE SIGN IS THE WONDER

When the crowd first arrives, Jesus notes that they had not appreciated the sign that he had already given; they are still focused on their physical hunger. When they ask for a sign, "that we may see and believe in you" (John 6:30), they refer to their ancestors who ate manna in the wilderness. Can Jesus top that? Can he give them more bread that will relieve them of their daily worries about going hungry?

Jesus reminds the crowd that it was not Moses who gave the "bread from heaven," but his Father. Further, the Father can give them the true bread from heaven that comes down and gives life to the world. There is a parallel in the Greek between working for food that perishes and doing the works of God, which is believing in Jesus as the one God has sent. This is the sign that the people missed the day before, the sign that Jesus is pointing out to them.

Like the Evangelist, the Church uses the word "sign" for its sacraments. Like the crowd, we are called to see similar "signs" of God's generosity in all the blessings of our lives.

Décimo Octavo Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

El Evangelio de hoy continúa en un segundo día de narración que comenzó el día anterior cuando, después de cruzar el lago para buscar a Jesús, una gran multitud fue alimentada con dos hogazas de pan y cinco pescados. El día siguiente (la lectura de hoy), después de cruzar otra vez el lago, las personas que habían sido alimentadas milagrosamente estaban buscando otra vez a Jesús. Sin embargo, lo hacen (como Jesús lo dice)

"no porque vieron signos, sino porque comieron los panes y quedaron satisfechos" (Juan 6:6).

En el Evangelio de Juan, la palabra "signo" tiene un significado distinto. En la boda de Caná, después de contar cómo Jesús convirtió el agua en vino, el evangelista menciona que "Jesús hizo esto como el principio de sus signos" que "revelaron su gloria, y sus discípulos empezaron a creer en él" (Juan 2:11). Para Juan, signos no son sólo milagros para contemplar, sino que se tratan de la revelación de Dios y de una respuesta de fe en Jesús.

TAL VEZ EL SIGNO ES EL MILAGRO

Cuando la multitud llega por primera vez, Jesús observa que no han apreciado el signo que él ya había hecho; pues la multitud está enfocada en su hambre física. Y cuando piden por un signo, "para que podamos ver y creer en ti" (Juan 6:30), se refieren a sus antepasados que comieron el maná en el desierto. ¿Puede Jesús superar eso? ¿Puede él darles más pan que les alivie de sus preocupaciones diarias por pasar hambre?

Jesús le recuerda a la multitud que no fue Moisés quien dio el "pan del cielo", sino el Padre. Además, el Padre puede darles el pan verdadero del cielo que baja y da vida al mundo. Hay una semejanza entre el lenguaje griego al decir trabajar por la comida que se echa a perder y hacer las obras de Dios, lo cual es creer en Jesús como el enviado de Dios. Este es el signo que la gente no vio el día anterior, el signo que Jesús les está indicando.

Como el evangelista, la Iglesia utiliza la palabra "signo" para sus sacramentos. Como la multitud, estamos llamados a ver de igual manera los "signos" de la generosidad de Dios en todas las bendiciones de nuestra vida.

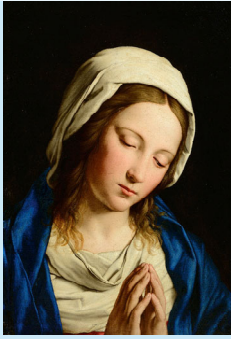

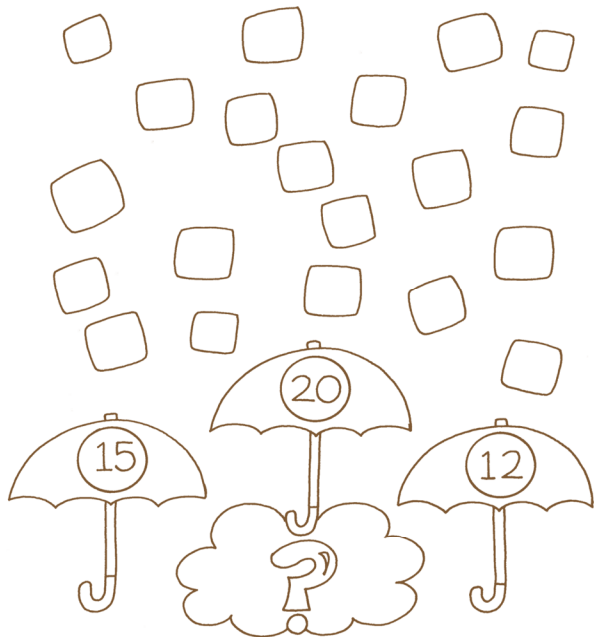

FEAST OF FAITH

The Preface: Thanksgiving

The preface of the Mass has been called “a poem, the cry of joy and recognition, the song of the world discovering its salvation . . . the certitude of faith making hope spring forth” (Philippe Béguerie, quoted in *The Mass*, Lucien Deiss, The Liturgical Press, Collegeville, MN, 1992, p. 70). The preface takes up the last words of the dialogue, and expresses briefly and simply why we are grateful, why it is right and just to give thanks and praise to God. On feast days, the preface sings of the specific mystery or saint we celebrate; in Ordinary Time, the Sunday and weekday prefaces express our gratitude for God’s gift of the Son, Jesus Christ, in whom we have redemption and newness of life. The prefaces offer a succinct account of what God has done for us in Christ; they express the mystery of faith, always relating it to us, to our lives. “By his birth we are reborn,” we hear in Preface IV for Sundays in Ordinary Time. “By his suffering we are freed from sin. By his rising from the dead we rise to everlasting life.” Yes, we have cause to give God thanks and praise.

FIESTA DE LA FE

Presencia real por excelencia

Una vez que los dones han sido consagrados por la acción del Espíritu Santo y que el sacerdote ha concluido la narración recordando las acciones y palabras de Cristo, el pan y el vino han dejado de ser pan y vino y se han convertido en el Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo. ¿Qué pasó? No fue una transformación, porque no hubo cambio de forma; no fue una transfiguración, porque no hubo cambio de figura; fue una transubstanciación porque hubo un cambio de sustancia, manteniendo así la misma forma y la misma figura. Esta presencia de Cristo, total y real, bajo las acciones de pan y de vino es la presencia real por excelencia y constituye la enseñanza principal de la Iglesia en torno a la presencia de Cristo. Así nos lo recuerda el Concilio de Trento: Por la consagración del pan y del vino se realiza la conversión de toda la sustancia del pan en la sustancia del Cuerpo de Cristo, Señor nuestro, y de toda la sustancia del vino en la sustancia de su sangre”. Se le llama presencia real, “no por exclusión. . . sino por antonomasia. . . porque por ella ciertamente se hace presente Cristo, Dios y hombre, entero e íntegro” (Ecclesia de Eucharistia, 15).
