



Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

As always in Ordinary Time, today's Old Testament reading sets the stage for the Gospel. God, who in Jesus will "rebuke the wind" and "command the sea to be still" (Mark 4:39), "addresses Job out of the storm" (Job 38:1), speaking to the turmoil in Job's heart, calling to mind the primal chaos of creation's untamed sea, reminding Job that God's mighty word then was enough to command order and bring forth life. In today's Gospel, the disciples' fear, even near despair, takes center stage. Are any of us strangers to such emotions? Squall-force winds buffet their boat, waves break over it, and Jesus might as well not be there. Mark's account is especially grim. Alone among the evangelists, he tells us that Jesus is in the stern, the very back of the boat, not just asleep—sound asleep! Only Mark adds the detail, "on a cushion" (4:38).

**AWAKEN CHRIST**

Though we welcome Jesus in Word and Eucharist Sunday after Sunday, haven't we all, from time to time, experienced Jesus' "real absence"? This personal application should comfort us, as it has generations of disciples before us. Though the "boat" is, primarily, a symbol of the Church, never forsaken by Christ, carried safely across time's stormy waters, Saint Augustine preaching on this very Gospel sixteen hundred years ago noted that, since each of us is a temple of God, each one's heart is a sailing boat. Consider any temptation, says Augustine, as "the wind, the surging of the sea," and do what the disciples did: wake up Christ, "the sleeper in your heart," by recalling his words and commands. Then be like the wind and the sea: "The sea obeys him, the wind is still." Whenever emotions make our hearts turbulent, whenever Christ seems absent or at least asleep, "let us not despair but awaken Christ, so that we may sail in quiet waters, and reach at last our heavenly homeland."

Duodécimo Domingo
del Tiempo Ordinario

Como siempre en el Tiempo Ordinario, las lecturas de hoy del Antiguo Testamento preparan el escenario para el Evangelio. Dios que, en Jesús, "reprenderá el viento" y "mandará calmar el mar" (Marcos 4:39), "se dirige a Job desde la tormenta" (Job 38:1), hablando desde la confusión de su corazón, recordando a Job que entonces la Palabra poderosa de Dios bastaba para con un orden devolver la vida. En el Evangelio de hoy, el miedo de los discípulos, incluso su desesperación, es el protagonista. ¿Acaso alguno de nosotros es ajeno a esas emociones? Los vientos de la borrasca golpean la barca, las olas rompen sobre ella y Jesús podría no estar ahí. El relato de Marcos es particularmente triste. Solo entre los evangelistas, él nos cuenta que Jesús está en la popa, en la parte trasera de la barca, y no solo dormido, sino que está profundamente dormido. Únicamente Marcos añade el detalle "sobre un cojín" (4:38).

DESPERTAR A CRISTO

Aunque acojamos a Jesús en la Palabra y la Eucaristía domingo tras domingo, ¿acaso no nos ha pasado a todos que experimentamos, de vez en cuando, la "ausencia real" de Jesús? Esta experiencia personal debería reconfortarnos, como así ha sucedido con generaciones de discípulos antes que nosotros. Aunque ante todo la barca es un símbolo de la Iglesia, nunca abandonada por Cristo, llevada con seguridad a través de las aguas tormentosas del tiempo, san Agustín al predicar sobre este mismo Evangelio hace mil seiscientos años, señaló que, puesto que cada uno de nosotros es un templo de Dios, el corazón de cada uno es una barca de vela. San Agustín dice: considera cualquier tentación como "el viento, el oleaje del mar", y haz lo que hicieron los discípulos, despierta a Cristo, "el durmiente en tu corazón", recordando sus palabras y mandamientos. Luego sé como el viento y el mar: "El mar lo obedece, el viento está tranquilo". Siempre que las emociones hagan turbulento nuestro corazón, siempre que Cristo parezca ausente o al menos dormido, "no nos desesperemos, sino despertemos a Cristo, para que podamos navegar en aguas tranquilas, y llegar por fin a nuestra patria celestial".

The table above indicates the financial status through April 30, 2021 and represents annual totals for Fiscal Year 20/21. The Parish was blessed to receive a large donation in September from the estate of a previous parishioner. However, this donation is earmarked for the support of evangelization and is not available to be

utilized for operational expenses and the positive balance year to date is attributed to this donation.

This report represents 83.3% of the 20/21 Fiscal Year. As reported in our last financial report update, envelopes, plate and online collections are slightly higher than last Fiscal Year (19/20). However, income from all special services such as Baptisms, Marriages, Religious Education, etc. is significantly lower than last Fiscal Year. In addition, although loosening COVID restrictions for in-person events is generating more interest in use of parish facilities, these bookings are for next Fiscal Year.

Thanks to generous ongoing contributions to the Building Fund, we have been able to do needed maintenance around the parish facilities such as complete remodel of the Youth Room, repainting in the chapel and extensive cleaning of the Aquinas Hall in preparation for event rentals.

Parish Administration realizes these are very challenging times, but if it is possible to increase your contributions, even slightly, this will greatly assist the Parish meet its expenses and reduce the need for withdrawals from the Parish Contingency Fund.





FEAST OF FAITH

The Collection: A Privilege

As the altar is prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist, the collection is taken up. In the early church, this part of the Mass must have been something to behold, as the people suddenly began to move, bringing forward to the deacons and priests freshly-baked bread and fine wine. Then, after the Eucharistic Prayer, that same community came forward again in the Communion procession, and they received back the very gifts they had given, now transformed into something infinitely more precious than bread and wine: the very Body and Blood of Christ.

Beginning around the eleventh century, it became the custom for people to present money instead of bread and wine, and the procession of the faithful gradually disappeared (it survives in the liturgy of Holy Thursday). But the meaning is the same. We continue to bring the fruit of our labors and to offer them freely to God. And God continues to transform them into Christ. It is through our generous sharing of time, talent, and treasure that our parishes can preach the gospel, reach out to the sick and the imprisoned, and celebrate the sacraments.

Es más que una bebida relajante o sabrosa, es la bebida sagrada porque en ella se acompaña una promesa, se marca un momento, se vive un juramento. Comer y beber siempre han sido un gesto de solidaridad entre hombres y mujeres; se come y bebe con quien se tiene confianza, con quien se es familia, con quien se espera re-crear la propia vida a partir de algo que va más allá de nosotros mismos.
